


PROFESSIONAL GROWTH BOOKS




A Nation in God's Hands: Ellen White and the Civil War, *Pacific Press Publishing Association*, 2017, 462 pages






Change Over Time in Children's Literacy Development, by Marie M. Clay, Heinemann, 2015, 328 pages




Embarrassment: and the Emotional Underlife of Learning, by Thomas Newkirk, *Heinemann*, 2017, 207 pages
